Spice Up Spellings!

Dear Parents and Carers.

As the new curriculum places an even stronger emphasis on the importance of spelling as a part of literacy, we are keen to ensure we are doing all we can to give children the skills they need to become competent spellers.

Following a recent pupil voice and parents survey, we are launching a new project to help support children with this. We have decided, as a Federation, that change needs to happen with regards to spelling. Research shows that the 'Look, Cover, Write, Check' format is not as effective as other strategies. Research and evidence shows that the children are learning their spellings for the purpose of a test, and not applying it to where it really needs to be used, **their writing**. We not only want our children to be able to spell the words they are using, but to be able to understand their meaning and use them within a context.

The children will have a spelling activities menu called 'Spice Up Spellings'. This new idea involves a range of spelling-based activities that allows children to use a variety of skills to support their learning of spelling, including music, art and computing. Therefore, if your child finds writing particularly tricky there are other opportunities to demonstrate their learning using other skills. This will apply to the children who currently receive spellings. (Years 1-6) The children will receive a new Spelling menu for the Autumn, Spring and Summer term. We have used the chilli system for grading the activities, from 'Mild' to 'XX Spicy'. Each activity has a box for parent/carers to sign and date. Make sure your child chooses an appropriate challenge that enables them to demonstrate what they are capable of. A new list of words will be provided each week and we will expect the children to complete **one** activity a week. If they wish to complete more, fantastic! The spelling menu will be sent home alongside the usual home learning given for that class. It will also be due in on the designated days for their particular class.

Each child will be given a group of words that they will bring home and apply to the menu. Our hope is to make the list of words your children bring home more personalised to them. For KS1 the children will continue to receive spelling words to use for the activities, which are generated by their phonics phase, some tricky words and some words highlighted from their writing. KS2 have statutory words that they are encouraged to learn alongside other key words used in their writing. It maybe, that although a new list will be sent home each week, it may contain words from previous weeks if the teacher feels that a child still needs to work on these.

The Federation will be launching our new spelling project this week. Class teachers will discuss this further with you at the curriculum planning meetings next week. The children have been informed from both schools of these changes via an assembly and were very enthusiastic about the new ideas and activities. We hope you will be too. Please do let me know if you have any queries or questions about this.
