### What does the Governing Body do?

In addition, as we are a voluntary aided Church of England Federation the Governing Body is responsible for admissions and is the employee of all members of staff. We are very fortunate in the St Thomas à Becket Federation to have a group of highly committed and skilled Governors who undertake this work voluntarily to ensure our schools deliver the very best for all our children.
