A – BB	Blackboys - Our vision promotes an education in which children face the challenges of the 21st Century with confidence. Expectation has been raised over the academic year. Numbers into the school are fairly consistent and the PAN has regularly been filled, therefore increased to 20, 2 years ago. However, the Admission number is 15 for 2019/20. Work is needed to improve the curriculum and ensure that our vision and the needs of the community is the driving force behind these curriculum changes.
	A - FF	Framfield- Ofsted (June 2019) confirmed that the school remains a good one. The school now has a permeant Headteacher who works in a supportive partnership with the Headteacher of Blackboys. The pupil admissions number is 15 and all places were filled in September 2018 and the

b. What is the whole educational experience of children attending this school?	G – BB	school is over subscribed for September 2019. The attached Pre-school has an excellent reputation, and this supports our admission numbers. Blackboys - The school is working hard to ensure that it is distinctly Christian underpinned by a theologically sound vision and values. Children are encouraged to "be the best they can be; living life in all its fullness". This is reinforced through a strong emphasis on children being a positive influence on their community and through an active and healthy lifestyle.
	A - FF	Framfield- We want every child to 'Be the best that they can be' and to 'Live Life in all its fullness' through a vibrant and challenging curriculum. The children achieve high standards and make good progress in literacy and mathematics. The school offers many enriching experiences including access to a wide range of sports (Framfield has the Gold School Games Award) and regular Forest School sessions. The Headteacher has introduced the annual arts festival as part of her vision for achieving and celebrating excellence.

A – BB	Blackboys – With a stronger emphasis on active learning, raising expectations and rewarding effort, the school is working hard on improving the progress children make. This is necessary particularly in Writing. Progress is therefore improving, and some year groups have made accelerated progress through 2018/19. As a school we would like to develop the way we
