Challenge – Can you write some facts about the artist you have chosen?	Find out what the candles on an Advent wreath mean and draw and write about what you find out. Write a prayer for those people in our country and around the world who won't have presents to open on Christmas Day, or might not have a Christmas dinner, or might not have a home.  What could you ask God for?
