#### SIAMS

On 23rd October we welcomed Mrs Gill Bradman, SIAMS Inspector, to Blackboys CE School. Despite a far more rigorous Inspection Framework, we are delighted to report that Blackboys continues to be judged a GOOD church school. This overall judgement is made by the inspector having considered the question "How effective is the school's distinctive Christian vision, established and promoted by leadership at all levels, in enabling pupils and adults to flourish?" The report findings stated that the school, was driven by good leadership at all levels; that the school is a supportive and inclusive community; that pupil behaviour was exemplary; and that there is a clear focus on care and respect between everyone. There was praise for our acts of worship and we are pleased the inspector

highlighted our charitable work and the opportunities available for enriching visits and extracurriculum activities. There is still some work to do in a rapidly improving RE curriculum, and the staff will be working hard to embed a new RE assessment system so we can support and challenge children's learning of RE even more effectively. The OFSTED Inspection Framework has been revised twice since our previous inspection in 2009 and the most recent change, September 2019 has created a very robust set criteria in which to judge schools. As soon as the report has been published, we will let parents know, but like the SIAMS Inspection, the children, staff and governors have been a credit to the school. We were also thrilled to see the huge level of parental engagement with the OFSTED process through the high number of people who completed OFSTED's online questionnaire. Thank you for your support.
