Home learning

Thank you for all the positive feedback regarding home learning. This has now re-started and will continue during term time for the duration of the partial school closure. Each day children will receive work on phonics/spelling, English and Maths. They will also receive set work on Art (or Music) on Mondays; Science on Tuesdays; History or Geography on Wednesdays; RE on Thursdays; and Computing on Fridays. Children are to complete the work set, remembering to "be the best they can be", in their exercise book. Should their exercise book be full, and no further paper or notebooks are available at home, please contact Mr Sullivan for a replacement exercise book.

It is super important that children keep up with their reading. There is access to online books through the Oxford Owl website, <u>www.oxfordowl.co.uk</u>; Username: Antarctic20; Password: Class1 **OR** Username: Rainforest20; Password: Class2. Please contact Mr Sullivan if you would like to arrange a physical book swap.

These will be taking place next Monday 27th and Tuesday 28th April via Zoom Video Conferencing. September 2020

Before the Easter break, we were delighted to recruit two new members of teaching staff to start in the new academic year, September 2020. Miss Emily Sanderson and Miss Daisy-Anne Mayhew greatly impressed in interview and will be class teachers, joining Mr Boorman in our newly expanded Key Stage 2. This is a new development for Blackboys and is due to our rising numbers throughout the school.

From September we will have three Key Stage 2 classes. The formerly named Jubilee Barn, will be utilised as a revamped classroom for Class 3 (comprising of Year 3 only). Class 4 will be situated in the current Class 3 classroom (comprising of a mixed age Year 4/5 class) and Class 5 will be located in the current Class 4 room (comprising of a mixed age Year 5/6 class). This exciting development will have the benefit of slightly smaller class sizes in Key Stage 2 and will allow a positive transition to Year 3.

In term 6 we will confirm which teacher will be teaching which class and begin the process, with consultation with parents, of allocating pupils to classes.

When the time comes, I know you will give a warm welcome to Miss Sanderson and Miss Mayhew as they begin their teaching careers with us.

Ways to keep in touch

Although there is no requirement for this, children and parents are very welcome to email class teachers with examples and photos of work. On top of this we continue to add daily content on our popular School 'YouTube' channel (search Blackboys School on the YouTube site). We also endeavour to keep the School twitter feed updated, which can be accessed via @blackboysschool or via the homepage of the School website. It is very important that we keep our motivation, routines and strong sense of community.

Community Initiative

There has been an exciting community initiative in both Blackboys and Framfield, seeing the bus shelters in the village turn into book swapping sites. As long as you are safe to do so, please use these facilities as they contain books for both adults and children and reading certainly can help break the monotony of lockdown.
