Frequently Asked Questions

What should I do if my child is poorly?

If your child has the symptoms of Covid-19, then it is vitally important that they do not attend school and that the family move to a period of self-isolation. Please let us know if this is the case and follow the guidance to arrange a test <https://www.gov.uk/guidance/coronavirus-covid-19-getting-tested>
Once there is an outcome, you will need to inform us of the result.

Will the school close if a child or adult contracts Covid-19?

Should there be any positive cases of Covid-19 at school, we will work with the East Sussex Health Protection Team to put out clear, swift information to parents. As we will be implementing control measures, we expect the need for whole-school closure will not become necessary.

What are the main protective measures the school will use?

Good hand hygiene continues to be a major protective measure, and we would value parents and carers talking to, and demonstrating this to their children before the restart.

Can my child wear a face covering?

There has been much debate on this subject. There is currently no necessity for children to wear a face covering at Primary School. If this guidance changes, we will contact parents. Parents will use a facial covering during drop off and pick up, unless they are exempt. Staff will wear face coverings when moving around the school site.

Is it true parents will need to have a regular Covid-19 test?

Further updates, when released will be communicated in upcoming newsletters, but it seems a sensible idea in terms of offering another layer of reassurance. All staff will take a rapid Covid-19 test twice a week.

Will school dinners be served?

Yes, Chartwells have committed to continuing hot school meals at school. There will be a staggered lunchtime so that the hall is not overcrowded and that pupils eat only with children of their Key Stage.

Will the children have playtime?

Yes. Children will play together as a Key Stage. Class 1 and 2 will play together and Class 3, 4 and 5 will play together.

Can the children have water bottles?

Yes, as the water fountain will not be available. However, we expect children to be responsible for their own bottle and to take it home nightly for washing.

Will PE take place?

Yes. As has always been the case, we are committed to physical exercise to boost fitness and well-being. PE sessions will take place twice a week, with hand washing before and after the sessions. Separate equipment will be used within the Key Stage bubbles and we have invested in an anti-bacterial sprayer, so equipment will be disinfected before and after use, as an additional control measure.

Will we have Breakfast Club and After School Club?

Yes. Breakfast Club and After-School Club will begin again on Monday 8th March but children will only mix within their Key Stage "bubble" while in the club. Staff will help with this. Please book your child in, in the normal way and use the special doorbell for entry and exit. Breakfast Club begins at 7:45am. There will be no access to the school before that time.

Will clubs be taking place?

Yes, but will initially be limited to guitar, Key Stage 1 football and KS 2/Girls football. RBMS will have contacted all previous guitar club participants ready for lessons from W/C 08/03. We shall contact you via ParentMail email Monday 08th March regarding the after school football club options.

What are the drop off and pick up times?

To ease congestion, we have drop off and pick up times for the different Key Stages: 8.40am for Key Stage 2 pupils and 8.50am for Key Stage 1 children. If you have children in both Key Stages, please drop off your children at the earliest time. Parents are to leave their children at the gate. Children will head straight to their classroom via their cloakroom. Staff will be available to help with this. The school gates will close at 8.55am, when all children are expected to be present.

At the end of the day the school gate will be opened at 3.10pm. Parents may come and wait, socially distanced, in the playground. Please stand on a pair of golden footsteps; one per family.

Class 1 parents will need to walk around the side of the building to the Class 1 outdoor area to collect their child. When they have met their child in the Class 1 outdoor area, they may leave through the school hall fire exits. A member of staff will help with this.

Class 2 pupils will be dismissed by their teacher to the playground via the class 2 external fire door at 3.15pm.

Class 3, 4 and 5 pupils will be led by their teachers to the playground at 3.20pm.

We expect children and parents to disperse quickly and efficiently please. We do not want parents to congregate around the school gate.

Does my child need to wear uniform?

Yes. There is a high expectation that children will wear the correct school uniform including traditional leather school shoes. A reminder of the school uniform code can be found here:

What should I do if my child is anxious about returning to school?

For most children, it is over 2 months since they were last in school, so it is entirely normal for them to be a little anxious. Parents could help by talking to their children about times of change and how they go about dealing with change as adults. We found that when pupils came back to school in September that there was soon a real desire to be taught and have new lessons and learning.

All classes will have a short period on re-adjusting, practicing routines and getting reacquainted. In addition to the core offer in classrooms, our daily acts of worship will provide children with thoughtful reflection time allowing us to focus on positive mental health and we also employ a school counsellor one afternoon a week who can pick up on more individual support that children may need. Most importantly, please communicate with your child's classteacher if you have any individual concerns. We are here to help.

What will the school work be like?

We plan to get in the swing of teaching new learning as quickly as possible. Many children will have improved their independent learning strategies while home schooling and we can see from the home learning books that the vast majority of pupils got on really well. Classteachers will be responsive to the needs of their pupils and plan lessons according to what the class need to learn. We are determined that children will be challenged educationally, and those that might need some additional catch-up interventions, in addition to taught lessons, will be catered for. We will communicate this clearly with parents if we feel it is necessary.

What if my child becomes poorly while at school?

We will continue to deal with poorly children as we have done previously, using our qualified first aiders. Should a child display Covid-19 symptoms, however, we have a bespoke planned protocol to isolate them swiftly and to contact parents immediately. Please ensure you are contactable during the school day. There are further details on our letter which was sent to parents Monday 01st March.

If my child has to self-isolate, what will they learn?

In the event that a child cannot come to school because of self-isolation, we will send details for home learning provided through Oak National Academy, the government funded online learning portal.
