Dear Parents / Carers,

Despite not enjoying the best of May weather, we have been able to utilise the school field and woodchip area in recent weeks, giving the children far more scope for creative play. Seeing and hearing the children playing so nicely together has been a pleasure after the confines of lockdown earlier in the year. We hope soon to be able to allow key stage 1 and key stage 2 children to mix at playtime too.

### Year 1 and Year 5 2021/22

Next week we will send out letters

to current Reception and Year 4

parents offering the opportunity

for a telephone conversation with Mr Sullivan to discuss Year 1 and Year 5 class placement. As parents are aware, to have manageable class sizes, we need to share our Year 1 cohort between Class 1 and Class 2 and our Year 5 cohort between Class 4 and Class 5. It is important for parents to understand that children follow their year group curriculum regardless of what class they are placed in. Our classteachers are skilled in differentiating work for mixed year groups and we have a specially designed curriculum to ensure no one repeats any subject content. All circumstances are unique, but to make decisions about Year 1 placements we look back at how a child has got on in Reception; looking at their independence and skills in reading, writing and maths together with how well they independently

demonstrate the characteristics of

For Year 5 placement we look carefully at Year 4 reading and maths assessment results and teacher assessments for writing, as we need to pick out children who will be able to cope with some elements of the Year 6 curriculum if they are placed in class 5.

At no stage is there any talk about children being "kept back" in a class. That is certainly not what the process is about. Please watch out for the letter with instructions on how to arrange a phonecall.

Times tables are then presented to the children in a variety of ways, perfect for those who like to visualise their sums. Please give it a try over the weekend. A trial with Class 5 proved popular.

initiative this Summer to support schools across the country by donating some refreshments after active endeavors on School Sports Day!


