Dear Parents / Carers,

This term seems to be racing along with lots of opportunities presenting themselves for all our pupils.

Project Touchline continues to run each Wednesday with the children creating Artwork this week based on the Christian values of Respect and Fellowship and how this links with faith and sport to help us live life in all its fullness. We also welcomed Mr Beale and some of his students from Lewes College on Wednesday. The students are learning about leadership in sport and they gained valuable experience in teaching Classes 2 and 3 on our all weather pitch. The children thoroughly enjoyed the sessions that they participated in.

Earlier in the week, Mrs Sullivan accompanied our Year 6 netball team to Beacon Academy, in Crowborough to take part in the North Wealden finals. Having qualified in January, it was our chance to play against schools across the north Wealden area. The standard of netball was high and the children showed great skill in attacking and defending. Within our pool, we came third which means that our journey through the competition has ended, but the children should all be very proud of their achievements this year.

We hope they continue to enjoy netball as they move onto secondary school.

Mr Boorman has been accompanying groups of children to play tag rugby at Uckfield College, this term. The children have received training in how to play followed by a noncompetitive tournament.

We welcomed children's author, Michael Mann, to school last Friday. Michael is a nominated East Sussex Book Awards author and spoke to Key Stage 2 about his two brilliant books, Ghostcloud and Nightspark.

Earlier in the week, Mr Sullivan announced the winner of our Federation Logo competition. Many children entered the competition and received a small prize for their efforts. The winning entry was designed by Maisie M in Class 5 and her entry will be made into a banner.

Last Monday, Class 3 led our assembly, sharing their learning about Ancient Egypt and the River Nile. They shared some letter writing based on their class text and wowed us with their singing. Well done Class 3. This Monday, Class 4 also entertained us with all the fantastic learning they have done on the theme of natural disasters. They shared their knowledge about tectonic plates, read out some suspense writing, showed us their artwork and played their recorders. It was a great assembly.
