Dear Parents and Carers, It feels strange to be writing my final newsletter of the school year, and my final newsletter as Interim Head of School. It has been a great year and I am very grateful for the support of all staff and parents during this time. The time has flown and I have learnt a great deal in this time.

These past two weeks have been as busy as usual at Blackboys School, starting with our very successful PTA-run Summer Fair. Payment Arrangements from new academic year 23/24

In preparation of the new academic year, as a School we shall be encouraging Parents/Carers to make trip payments via ParentPay. Consent slips will still need to be brought into the Office as previously arranged. We are also looking into the viability of having a card machine in the office to enable payments via this method. We shall of course keep you updated.

September 2023, School start and finish times As you may have read in the press the Government has recently recommended a school week of 32 1/2 hours. At Blackboys our start time is 8.40am (pedestrian gate opening) and a finish of 3:15pm each day.

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With this in mind we shall be more stringent on late marks being applied.

The pedestrian gate will be shut at 8.55am. Should your child arrive at School after the register has been taken in class a 'late' mark will be applied. Please note that an excessive amount of late marks will trigger an attendance review meeting.


