Rehearsals are in full swing! Letters regarding pupil costumes have been sent out. Costumes will need to be in school by Friday 07th July 2023.

There will be three performances of Hoodwinked; Wednesday 12th July (2pm and 6pm) and Thursday 13th July (6pm). All performances will be ticketed. Tickets will

be available from the School Office from Monday 3rd July where you will be able to buy x2 tickets per family at the price of £1 each (cash only payment). There will be a 'reserve' list held for each performance and should you require additional tickets, your name will be added to this. Tickets on the reserve list will then then be released and available from the School Office on Monday 10th July.

For the afternoon performance on the 12th July, the pedestrian gate will be open from 1.50pm to allow the audience to take their seats for a 2pm start. A normal end of School finish of 3.15pm will remain. After School wrap around care will take place as normal alongside the last session of Archaeology Club for the term (all other clubs will have finished the previous week).
