#### Dear Parents / Carers,

Welcome to term 4! This Spring term is always a special one as the days begin to get longer, the rain begins to fade (we hope) and we are treated to a beautiful display of spring daffodils on the verges of School Lane. These daffodils were planted nearly 4 years ago to encourage correct use of the verges by motor vehicles and are a timely reminder about how we expect our school community to park at pick up and drop off. Perfectly linked to this, our Christian Value of the term is Respect. Having respect for our locality is something our pupils take very seriously.

### Trips and Visits

Although the term is only 2 weeks old, we have already conducted important trips, with our Year 6s visiting London and the Houses of Parliament and our year 3s visiting Brighton Museum. It was so pleasing to hear positive reports and feedback about the trips and our pupils were a real credit to the school and the parents.

#### Mathletics

Due to rising subscription costs and negligible usage/uptake, we

have made the difficult decision to reduce our Mathletics subscription. We now hold 20 Mathletics licenses for use by 20 pupils. Using data from the site we have worked out that 14 children use the site regularly and we have purchased 6 additional licenses on top of this. Should your child be a very keen Mathletics user, or is seriously keen to become one, please email Mr Boorman rboorman@blackboys.e-sussex.sch.uk to reserve one of these licenses so that your child can continue on their Mathletics journey. Please be assured that children will still have full access to the Maths part of Purple Mash (please contact classteachers for a reminder of your child's loa in details) and all Key Stage 2 children have a login for TT Rockstars. Mr Boorman is researching more cost effective maths programs for Key stage 1 pupils and will update the school community via a letter very soon.

#### **Bumped Head Wristbands**

Our school first aiders, Mrs Pomfret and Mrs Harper do a remarkable job in helping children who are injured and poorly. To hep further they are implementing a 'bumped head wristband' scheme. This will replace the bumped head sticker, which were notorious for peeling off jumpers prior to 3:15pm. The wristbands are (I'm told!) Festival style wristbands and are more likely to stay on a child, thus informing parents that a bang on the head has occurred. An information letter will still be put in your child's bookbag and first aiders will still call parents for serious bumps. To help our first aiders, please cut off your child's wristband prior to returning to school the next day.
