#### The Wind in the Willows

Song words and costume letters were sent home this week via your child's bag and ParentMail email. Costumes need to be in School, in a named bag by Friday 11th July.

There will be three performances of The Wind in the Willows: Wednesday 16th July (2pm and 6pm) and Thursday 17th July (6pm). All performances will be ticketed.

Tickets will be available from the School Office from next Monday 30th June where you will be able to buy  $\times 2$  tickets per family at the price of £1 each (cash only payment). There is a special 'Bugle Newspaper' attached to this newsletter!

There will be a 'reserve' list held for each performance and should you require additional tickets, your name will be added to this. Tickets on the reserve list will then then be released and available from the School Office on Thursday 10th July. For the afternoon performance on the 16th July, the pedestrian gate will be open from 1.50pm to allow the audience to take their seats for a 2pm start. A normal end of School finish of 3.15pm will remain. After School wrap around care will take place as normal. For evening performances the pedestrian gate will be opened at approximately 5:40pm for actors and audience to enter. Please remember we expect all pupils to attend all performances.

## Wrap Around Care 25/26

Wrap around care, Breakfast and After School Clubs will continue to run up until and including the last day of term, Friday 18th July.

Bookings for the wrap around care provision of Breakfast and After School Club are already open for the new academic year, 25/26. As explained in the last fortnightly newsletter there will be a 50p increase on all wraparound care options due to the increased running costs of the clubs. With regret we will also stop our sibling discount rule for the same reason. Please email your booking to the School Office via email and state in the email subject that the booking is a new 25/26 booking. As we have done so this year, we shall be limiting spaces available. Bookings from this year (24/25) WILL NOT be 'rolled over'.
